

# OTOLARYNGOLOGY—HEAD & NECK SURGERY

## HSC Rotation Goals and Objectives (PGY-3)

The following is a list of goals and objectives which should be attained at the conclusion of the PGY-3 rotation at the Hospital for Sick Children.

### **Communicator**

1. Present histories, physical findings, and management plans to consultants in an organized, efficient, and confident manner.
2. Prepare clear and concise notes, discharge summaries, operative reports, and present effectively in organized rounds and seminars.
3. Be able to discuss all common Otolaryngology procedures with patients and their families in a clear and understandable form, including risks/benefits, informed consent, and post-operative care.

### **Collaborator**

1. Identify situations where consultation of other physicians or health care professionals is appropriate.
2. Demonstrate collegial and professional relationships with all co-workers and colleagues.
3. Recognize and respect the expertise and roles of allied health professionals such as speech language pathologists, audiologists, technicians, nurses, and clerical staff.

### **Manager**

1. Keep an up-to-date log of surgical procedures and clinics attended on the POWER software.
2. Understand the importance of resource management, and utilize resources effectively to balance patient care duties, learning needs, educational/teaching responsibilities and outside activities.
3. Accurately identify criteria for patient admission to hospital in the urgent/emergent situation as well as the implications of such decisions.

### **Health Advocate**

1. Recognize and respond to opportunities for advocacy within Otolaryngology, both for your patients as well as for the community in which we practice (e.g., smoking cessation, alcohol consumption)
2. Demonstrate familiarity with important determinants of health affecting head and neck surgery such as smoking and alcohol consumption

### **Scholar**

1. Develop a personal Educational strategy and actively participate in the education of junior colleagues.
2. Demonstrate the evolving commitment to life-long learning and evidence-based practices.

### **Professional**

1. Deliver highest quality care with integrity, honesty, and compassion.
2. Practice medicine and Otolaryngology in an ethically responsible manner.
3. Recognize limitations, and seek assistance when necessary.

General Skills	1. Become comfortable with the preoperative and postoperative management of paediatric patients who have undergone otolaryngology-head and neck surgery including office management.	
	2. Develop an approach to interpreting paediatric diagnostic imaging of all head and neck sites.	
	3. Become familiar with the indications for common paediatric otolaryngology-head and neck surgical procedures, as well as the risks and benefits for each.	
	4. Perform a detailed and thorough head and neck examination.	
	5. Obtain a detailed paediatric medical history, including prenatal history, family history, genetic history, and developmental milestones as relevant.	
Paediatric Head and Neck Surgery	1. Perform adeno-tonsillectomy with limited direct consultant intervention.	
	2. Perform upper aero-digestive endoscopy in paediatric patients.	
	3. Perform rigid bronchoscopy and foreign body removal.	
Rhinology	1. Perform nasal foreign body removal.	
	2. Understand the indications and contraindications for endoscopic sinus surgery in the paediatric population.	
	3. Demonstrate an organized approach to congenital sino-nasal anomalies.	
	4. Develop an approach to obstructive sleep apnea, including management.	
Neurotology & Otology	1. Develop a classification scheme and approach to the management of common congenital and acquired causes of paediatric hearing loss.	
	2. Perform foreign body removal from the ear.	
	3. Be able to interpret conventional audiometry and tympanometry in children.	
	4. Participate in the post-operative ward and office management of patients who have undergone otologic surgery.	
	5. Perform myringotomy with ventilation tube insertion under supervision.	
	6. Perform cortical mastoidectomy and elevation of tympanomeatal flap.	
General Head and Neck Surgery	1. Be able to perform the following (circle any procedure that you do not feel sufficiently comfortable with): EAC debridement, neonatal airway assessment including flexible endoscopy, wound closure, thyroglossal duct removal, dermoid removal.	
Head and Neck Oncologic Surgery	1. Develop an approach to common paediatric neoplasms, including investigation and management.	
	2. Assess and stage paediatric malignancies of the head and neck.	
	3. Demonstrate a basic grasp of adjuvant therapies for the treatment of paediatric head and neck malignancies (radiotherapy, chemotherapy) and management of their complications.

	2. Perform rigid suspension laryngoscopy and papilloma removal.

	4. Understand laser applications in paediatric Head and Neck surgery.	
Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery	1. Develop an approach to common cutaneous lesions seen in the Paediatric population, and their investigation and management.	
	2. Develop an approach to congenital facial anomalies, with an understanding of the relevant embryology.
