The following is a list of goals and objectives which should be attained at the conclusion of the PGY-4 rotation at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre.

Communicator

1. Present histories, physical findings, and management plans to consultants in an organized, efficient, and confident manner. Prepare clear and concise notes, reports and seminars.
2. Be able to discuss all basic and more complex Otolaryngology procedures with patients and their families in a clear and understandable form, including risks/benefits, informed consent, and post-operative care

Collaborator

1. Identify situations where consultation of other physicians or health care professionals is appropriate
2. Demonstrate collegial and professional relationships with all co-workers and colleagues

Manager

1. Begin to assume more responsibility in a senior role; demonstrate ability to lead a health care team
2. Keep an up-to-date log of surgical procedures and clinics attended on the POWER software
3. Utilize resources effectively to balance patient care duties, learning needs, educational/teaching responsibilities and outside activities

Health Advocate

1. Recognize and respond to opportunities for advocacy within Otolaryngology, both for your patients as well as for the community in which we practice (e.g., smoking cessation, alcohol consumption)

Scholar

1. Actively participate in the teaching of junior colleagues and other healthcare professionals (didactic, in clinics, and on wards/in OR)
2. Demonstrate the evolving commitment to, and the ability to practice, life-long learning

Professional

1. Deliver highest quality care with integrity, honesty, compassion and professionalism
2. Practice medicine and Otolaryngology in an ethically responsible manner
3. Endeavour to develop an appropriate balance between personal and professional life to promote personal physical and mental health/wellbeing as an essential to effective, life-long practice

General Skills	1. Promptly and effectively assess patients with airway emergencies including airway obstruction and supervise junior colleagues in this situation

	4. Demonstrate a sophisticated approach to imaging studies including independent interpretation of findings	
Neurotology & Otology	1. Become an expert in assessing and managing conductive and sensorineural hearing loss, and the counselling of patients regarding treatment options	
	2. Understand the principles, application, and interpretation of audiometry, tympanometry, ABR, OAEs, ENG, and EcOG	
	3. Perform tympanoplasty, mastoidectomy, and ossiculoplasty surgery with consultant intervention, elevate a tympanomeatal flap with limited consultant intervention, assist at surgery for treatment of otosclerosis	
	4. Demonstrate an organized approach to management of disorders of CN VII	
	5. Demonstrate a rational approach to selection of candidates, and performance of cochlear implant surgery, and post-operative rehabilitation and assessment	
	6. Develop a rational approach to vestibular rehabilitation, & surgery for vertigo	
	7. Accurately assess patients suffering temporal bone trauma	
	8. Assist at and demonstrate a logical approach to surgery for treatment of lateral skull base lesions	
Rhinology	1. Perform surgical treatments for epistaxis including endoscopic sphenopalatine artery ligation and anterior ethmoid artery ligation	
General Head and Neck Surgery	1. Be able to perform the following (circle any procedure that you do not feel sufficiently comfortable with): lymph node and neck mass biopsy; excision of submandibular glands, branchial cleft cysts and thyroglossal duct cysts; excision of oral cavity lesions; parotidectomy, neck dissection, thyroidectomy and parathyroidectomy, with increasing degree of autonomy	
Head and Neck Oncologic Surgery	1. Rapidly stage malignancies of the H&N and develop management approaches	
	2. Perform panendoscopy independently with accurate interpretation of findings	
	3. Perform medial maxillectomy and more extensive maxillectomies, composite resections and pharyngolaryngectomies with consultant supervision	
Laryngology	1. Management of vocal cord paralysis including investigation, medical therapy, and surgical therapy	



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	2. Perform rigid suspension laryngoscopy and with supervision, endoscopic laser resections of early tumors of the larynx	
	3. Develop a differential diagnosis and management plan for dysphonia and dysphagia	
Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery	1. Diagnosis and treatment of cutaneous malignancies including appropriate reconstruction (local and regional flaps)	
	2. Understand the management principles and/or perform surgical repair of mandible fractures including the use of M-M fixation and plates, as well as mid-face fracture repair, and airway/aerodigestive tract and soft tissue trauma	
	3. Demonstrate sophisticated understanding of the hierarchy of reconstructive options for defects in the head and neck. Formulate plan for reconstruction of head and neck defects with attention to form and function
