The following is a list of goals and objectives which should be attained at the conclusion of the PGY-5 rotation at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre.

At the end of the rotation the resident will be able to

Communicator

1. Discuss all common Otolaryngology procedures with patients and their families in a clear and understandable form, including risks/benefits, informed consent, and post-operative care.

Collaborator

1. Present histories, physical findings, and management plans to consultants in an organized, efficient, and confident manner.
2. Identify situations where consultation of other physicians or health care professionals is appropriate.
3. Demonstrate collegial and professional relationships with all co-workers and colleagues.

Leader

1. Demonstrate an ability to lead a health care team.

3. Utilize resources effectively to balance patient care duties, learning needs, educational/teaching responsibilities and outside activities.

Health Advocate

1. Recognize and respond to opportunities for advocacy within Otolaryngology, both for your patients as well as for the community in which we practice (e.g., smoking cessation, alcohol consumption).
2. Demonstrate the sensitivity to meet the non-physical as well as the physical needs of the patient and organize appropriate hospital resources such as chaplaincy, dietician, social service, psychology, occupational health and physiotherapy.
3. Develop and support constructive relationships with management and administrators of the hospital and demonstrates an understanding of the triage waitlist system for otolaryngology surgery.

Scholar

1. Actively participate in the teaching of medical students and other healthcare professionals (didactic, in clinics, and on wards/in OR).
2. Demonstrate the evolving commitment to, and the ability to practice, life-long learning.

Professional

1. Demonstrate a commitment to excellence in clinical care and personal ethical conduct. Exhibit proper professional behaviour, including adhering to legal and ethical codes of practice.
2. Practice medicine and Otolaryngology in an ethically responsible manner.
3. Endeavour to develop an appropriate balance between personal and professional life to promote personal physical and mental health/wellbeing as an essential to effective, life-long practice.
4. Disclose an adverse event or medical error in appropriate circumstances.
5. Demonstrate insight into his/her limitations. Responsive to constructive feedback.

General Skills	1. Promptly and effectively assess patients with airway emergencies including airway obstruction and supervise medical students in this situation.	
	2. Participate in the post-operative ward and office management of patients who have undergone all forms of otolaryngologic procedures, including running a Resident's Clinic independently.	
	3. Have a detailed plan of action for intraoperative and postoperative complications and be able to explain the rationale for each method.	
	4. Demonstrate a sophisticated, independent approach to imaging studies.	
Neurotology & Otology	1. Demonstrate expertise in assessing and managing conductive and sensorineural hearing loss, and the counselling of patients regarding treatment options.	
	2. Demonstrate an understanding of the principles and application of audiometry, auditory brainstem response (ABR), Otoacoustic Emissions (OAEs), and electronystagmography (ENG).	
	3. Perform tympanoplasty and mastoidectomy with limited supervision.	
	4. Perform ossiculoplasty and otosclerosis surgery with consultant supervision.	
	5. Demonstrate an organized approach to management of disorders of CN VII.	
	6. Assist with treatment of lateral skull base lesions including acoustic neuromas, other benign CPA lesions, and petrous apex lesions.	
	7. Accurately assess patients suffering temporal bone trauma including ordering appropriate investigations.	
	8. Demonstrate a sophisticated approach to auditory and vestibular rehabilitation including surgical and non-surgical options.	
	9. Assist in candidate selection, and performance of cochlear implant surgery.	
General Head & Neck Surgery	1. Perform the following (circle any procedure that you do not feel sufficiently comfortable with): lymph node and neck mass biopsy; excision of submandibular glands, thyroglossal duct cysts; excision of oral cavity lesions; parotidectomy, neck dissection, thyroidectomy and parathyroidectomy, with increasing degree of autonomy.	

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Head & Neck Oncologic Surgery	1.	
	2.	Demonstrate a comprehensive understanding and a detailed management plan for Head and Neck complications and emergencies, such as airway obstruction and trauma.
	3.	Perform panendoscopy independently with accurate interpretation of findings.
	4.	Perform medial maxillectomy and more extensive maxillectomies, composite resections and pharyngolaryngectomies, with consultant supervision.
	5.	Perform office-based ultrasound of thyroid and lateral neck, and transnasal esophagoscopy.
	6.	Demonstrate an understanding of the complexities of cutaneous melanoma surgery and sentinel lymph node biopsy.
Laryngology	1.	Demonstrate a diagnostic approach for and management of vocal cord paralysis, including thyroplasty and injection laryngoplasty.
	2.	Perform direct laryngoscopy, microlaryngeal surgery (CO2 laser, microdebrider, etc), and endoscopic laser resections of early tumours of the larynx.
Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery	1.	Diagnose and treat cutaneous malignancies including appropriate reconstruction (local and regional flaps)
	2.	Demonstrate an understanding of the management principles and/or perform surgical repair of mandible fractures including the use of M-M fixation and plates, as well as mid-face fracture repair
	3.	Demonstrate sophisticated understanding of the hierarchy of reconstructive options for defects in the head and neck, including free flaps. Formulate plan for reconstruction of head and neck defects with attention to form and function.
