


The 22nd Annual PERCY IRELAND Academic Day and Dinner

Percy Edgerton Ireland

Dr. Ireland was the first full time Professor of Otolaryngology at the University of Toronto. A medical graduate of the University of Toronto, he trained in Otolaryngology with Harris P. Mosher at Harvard. After a distinguished war career, much of it in the Western Desert, he returned to Toronto and was appointed Professor and Chairman in 1946, a position he held, along with that of Otolaryngologist-in-Chief at Toronto General Hospital until 1966. He finished his University career at Sunnybrook Hospital by helping the change over from a Veterans' to a University Hospital. He retired in 1969, leaving as his legacy a strong academic staff, many of whom held high positions in the University. He was a tough but a self-effacing man, who started the residency-training programme in Otolaryngology. He was extremely active in the educational field and it is fitting that his name be remembered in an academic event for trainees.

Michael G, Stewart, MD, MPH

Dr. Stewart is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery at Weill Cornell Medical College in New York City. He also serves as Vice Dean of Medical College, the E. Darracott Vaughan MD Senior Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs, and as Otolaryngologist-in-Chief at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell Medical Center. He received a B.E. degree summa cum laude from Vanderbilt University, and an M.D. from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He completed residency training at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, and received his M.P.H. degree from the University of Texas School of Public Health in Houston. He was on the Otolaryngology faculty at Baylor before moving to Weill Cornell in 2005.

Dr. Stewart is the author of 2 textbooks, and more than 25 book chapters and 100 peer-reviewed publications. He is Editor-in-Chief of The Laryngoscope journal, and is a Director of the American Board of Otolaryngology and Chairman of the Education Council of the Board. He is also the immediate Past-President of the Association of Academic Departments of Oto-HNS, and in 2011 he was elected to the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Otolaryngology-HNS.

His research interest is in outcomes and quality of life research, and he has received research funding from the NIH and AHRQ among others. Dr. Stewart is listed in Best Doctors in America and in New York by Castle Connolly, and also listed in Marquis Who's Who in America, Who's Who in the World, and Who's Who in Medicine and Healthcare.
