## Course Description

This course is designed for the practicing otolaryngologist who wishes to enhance his or her knowledge on the most current medical and surgical management of allergic rhinitis, chronic rhinosinusitis with and without polyps. The topics are extremely relevant to otolaryngology fellows and residents as well. Cadaveric dissection demonstrations will highlight step-by-step techniques in endoscopic sinus surgery and management of intraoperative complications. The material will be presented via didactic lectures followed by audience participation in question and answer sessions along with panel discussions with the experts as well as video discussion sessions.

- Avoid and manage complications encountered in sinus surgery
- Endoscopic management of epistaxis
