Joseph K. H. Wong/Smile China Lecture



I am pleased to announce that Dr. Khaled Almilaji will be this year's Joseph K.H. Wong/Smile China Lecturer. He will give the lecture on Friday January 12, 2018 during our regularly scheduled Grand Rounds.

Dr. Almilaji arrived in Toronto in June 2017 and is currently a graduate student at the UofT's Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation. He finished medical school in Syria in 2005 and started working for a pharmaceutical company while completing his residency in OHNS. He planned to do a head and neck fellowship but in 2011 the Syrian revolution started. He worked as a physician during the Syrian Civil war, treating wounded protesters, soldiers (secret hospitals were setup by physicians) and vaccinating children. He was arrested in Damascus for treating protesters. He endured torture, deprivation of food and water and unsanitary conditions including bug infested cells. He was released after 6 months.

In 2013 the first case of polio was found in eastern Syria. There was no single group in that part of Syria that could organize mass vaccinations so he and his colleagues pulled together 8,500 volunteers and figured out all of the logistics including obtaining equipment and supplies. After obtaining approval from the WHO, he and his colleagues vaccinated approximately 1.2 million children over an eight day period. Initially they did not have funding and used money set aside for food to fund the efforts. By the fourth round of vaccinations they had full funding from the Gates Foundation.

In 2016 he applied for a Master's in Public Health at Brown University in Rhode Island (USA). He was accepted with full scholarship and moved to Providence with his new bride and found out she was pregnant in December 2016.

In January 2017 he went to Turkey for a one week visit. He was supposed to be home by January 8th and was initially told there was a 'problem' with his visa. When he returned to the airport a few days later, he was then told that his visa had been revoked. While stranded in Turkey, he continued his humanitarian work.

His dilemma reached both Brown University and UofT's Dalla Lana School of Public Health. They suggested he be considered for and subsequently was successful in being accepted in the UofT's Executive Master of Health Informatics program. He received assistance from Canadian humanitarian leaders, private support and UofT funding. In June 2017 he was able to leave Turkey for Toronto and he and his wife now live on campus in student housing. Some of his Canadian friends drove down to Rhode Island to pack up his apartment and drive his wife to Toronto.

We look forward to hearing more from this remarkable man who has already achieved more humanitarian feats than most of us could dream of.





Face the Future™ Foundation continues to advance its mission, "providing hope – one child at a time".

During this academic year planning has moved to the final stages for surgical missions to Kigali, Rwanda and Ulyanovsk, Russia early in 2018. The former mission in February will have 16 team members providing surgical care for major head and neck tumours, traumatic maxillofacial deformities, and nasal & ear reconstruction. Several free flaps will be performed. The latter Ulyanovsk mission in March will have 9 members and will focus on facial reconstructive, pediatric urologic and pediatric general surgery.

The Foundation is also seeking to increase its international footprint, with a pilot mission already completed to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia in October. There is a potential opportunity to partner with the Toronto Addis Ababa Academic Collaboration Project (TAAAC). Pilot missions are confirmed for Cochabamba, Bolivia and the Dominican Republic in the first quarter of 2018.

To build on the Foundation's success, and to move forwards to expand its missions, four new members were recently elected to its Board of Directors. Dr. Adamson, on behalf of the Foundation, continues to extend the opportunity to senior residents to participate in these missions. Funding for the residents is provided by the Department through the Joseph Wong Global Health Outreach Fund.
