I want to highlight our promotions process, alumni relations and philanthropy.

In addition, there are two new chairs in the department – the endowed Jordan and Lisa Gnat Family and Bastable-Potts Chair in Otolaryngology held by the Otolaryngologist-in-Chief at HSC (first Chair holder Dr. Blake Papsin) and an expendable Chair in Laryngology and Voice at SMH (first Chair holder Dr. Jennifer Anderson), congratulations!

As time so often "flies by", I have now completed four years as Chair and want to thank all of our residents, fellows, faculty and alumni for their ongoing support. We will undergo the customary external review mandated by the Faculty of Medicine on February 27-28, 2017. I believe the external reviewers will be impressed by the amazing education, research and camaraderie taking place in our department.
