COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Annual Otolaryngology Update is a one-day conference geared toward practicing otolaryngologists, allied health professionals, and trainees who wish to enhance their knowledge on various topics spanning the different subspecialties of otolaryngology. A program committee uses divisional input and needs assessment to develop a program that reflects the current key areas of otolaryngology — head & neck surgery. The material will be presented via didactic lectures, followed by audience participation in question and answer sessions along with panel discussions.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

After active participation in this update meeting, participants will be able to:

- **Apply** contemporary diagnostic and surgical strategies to optimize management of patients with conductive hearing loss
- **Evaluate** the current evidence for hyperbaric oxygen therapy in SSNHL to **inform** timely and appropriate treatment recommendations
- **Identify and implement** evidence-based strategies to **prevent and manage** complications during endoscopic sinus surgery
- **Integrate** key functional and aesthetic principles of modern rhinoplasty into clinical assessment, counselling, and referral decisions
- **Incorporate** key updates from the ATA 2025 guidelines into the evaluation and management of thyroid disease
- **Analyze** complex airway emergencies and **apply** effective crisis-management approaches to enhance patient safety
- **Assess and adopt** practical AI tools that can **enhance** diagnostic accuracy, workflow efficiency, and patient care in ENT practice.
