COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for the practicing otolaryngologist who wishes to enhance his or her knowledge on the most current medical and surgical management of chronic rhinosinusitis, with and without polyps. The topics are extremely relevant to otolaryngology fellows and residents as well. Model dissection demonstrations will highlight step-by-step techniques in endoscopic frontal sinus surgery and management of intraoperative complications via a video-simulated session. The material will be presented via didactic lectures, followed by audience participation in question and answer sessions, along with panel discussions with the experts as well as video discussion sessions.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

After active participation in this meeting, participants will be able to:

- Identify important anatomic structures of the lateral nasal wall
- Describe a systematic approach to the interpretation of sinus CT imaging
- Discuss new pathophysiology of CRS
- Demonstrate key maneuvers in revision sinus surgery
- Choose the appropriate medical therapies for treatment of chronic rhinosinusitis
- Avoid and manage complications encountered in sinus surgery
